



WORK ON KEWDALE INDUSTRIAL PRECINCT COMPLETE

Gateway WA's upgrade of the Kewdale Industrial Precinct is now complete, providing a more efficient local road network in the industrial area and supporting the overall upgrade of the road network around the Perth Airport.

A large amount of work has been undertaken in the Kewdale Industrial Precinct since the upgrade began in 2013. With the exception of some minor finishing work being carried out, all improvements and modifications to the network have been made and have been in operation since the beginning of the year.

The project team worked on 10 intersections in the Kewdale Industrial Precinct, three of which had new traffic signals installed. One of the most significant changes in the industrial area was extending Bell Street to provide a direct connection between Miles Road and Orrong Road. This supports the upgrade of Leach Highway between Orrong Road and the Perth Airport to an expressway standard. In the Kewdale Industrial Precinct the project team:

- Dug, excavated, profiled and compacted 25,000 square metres of sub-grade road base
- Placed, rolled, compacted and trimmed more than 10,000 cubic metres of sub-base and base-course material
- Installed more than 3,000 metres of drainage.

Finishing ahead of schedule is welcome news to businesses and the community who will immediately benefit from the improvements that have been made.

Gateway WA is now delivering the second half of the project with the overall completion date targeting the middle of next year. As parts of the project finish this year they will be progressively opened to traffic.
