



Belmont's own Community Bank[®] branch

Excitement has been building in Belmont at the prospect of establishing a campaign to start its very own **Community Bank[®]** branch.

"Together Bendigo Bank and the local community share the revenue, with local surpluses available for reinvestment into the community via grants, sponsorships and dividends to local shareholders.

"Just like any branch of Bendigo Bank, **Community Bank[®]** branches offer a full range of banking and financial services, from everyday savings accounts to business banking and financial planning," she said.

"By making a pledge you will be able to purchase shares in the local company that operates the **Community Bank[®]** branch," Councillor Hanlon said.

"It's similar to investing in any other company-you can buy and sell your shares, have voting rights and eventually, receive dividends.

"The sooner the local community can show its support by transferring its business to the **Community Bank[®]** branch, the sooner the branch will become profitable and can reinvest back into the community."

There are currently more than 260 **Community Bank[®]** branches across Australia that have returned more than \$40 million to support local communities.
