BPW BUSINESS INCUBATOR PROJECT GOES GLOBAL

The Chinese Taipei Foundation for Women's Rights Promotion and Development is collaborating with Australia's Belmont Business Enterprise Centre Inc (BEC Global), Textile Clothing and Footwear Resource Centre WA (TCF Global) and the BPW Business Incubator Training and Mentoring Program on a pilot study to assist women in Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation's (APEC) economies to develop their small business skills.

"Our goal for this project is to develop business skills and business growth potential for women in small business internationally," Belmont Business and Professional Women's Club (Belmont BPW) President Carol Hanlon said.

The BPW Business Incubator ONLINE Training and Mentoring APEC Project evolved from the APEC aim to support women's economic empowerment.

The program targets women in Chinese Taipei, Republic of Korea, Chile, the Philippines and Australia and offers twenty hours of online skills training, one hour of mentoring and a certificate of completion.
