

Everyone should know this hand sign for someone in distress

The "SOS" hand signal, officially called the Signal for Help, is a one-handed gesture where a person tucks their thumb into their palm and folds their four fingers over it in a continuous motion, signifying a request for assistance in a dangerous situation, particularly domestic abuse or trafficking, without alerting an abuser. This discreet nonverbal tool is used when verbal communication is unsafe, and if someone sees this signal, they should discreetly contact authorities and report that the person may be in danger, while also trying to get a description and location to help the victim.

A quick trick in Excel to create a list of names from email addresses

Copy the list of email addresses into a column in Excel. In the adjacent column, type how you want the names to appear (e.g.: for Fred.Smith@Gmail.com - type Fred Smith. Then enter the next name on the list (so there are two examples). Place the cursor in the cell below the last example and press Ctrl and E. All the names on the list will be extracted and listed automatically.



Microsoft Tips

To copy a file on the desktop – Hold Ctrl, click on the file icon, and drag

To access a wide range of emojis and GIFS: Hold the Windows key and . - To see more emojis, click on > / to see more GIFS: click on > and enter a topic.

Malicious Software Removal Tool – in search, type MRT / Yes / select Quick Scan or Full Scan – computer will scan for malicious software and give a report.


To speed up your computer – Click on Settings / select Apps / Startup / Sort by, then Startup impact – turn off unwanted Apps.

To stop website tracking in Chrome – click on the three dots (upper right corner of screen) / select Settings / click on Privacy and Security / Third Party Cookies / then: Do not track.

Gloves off as ATO is set to go after delinquent small businesses

Small businesses account for two-thirds of the overdue \$50 billion in tax owed to the Australian Tax Office – and they have been warned that debt collection efforts are about to be ramped up. The ATO attributes the rising levels of tax debt to the increasing cost of goods and services, which is affecting nearly every industry. However, while noting that the level of debt is being "stabilised" thanks to firmer recovery strategies, Commissioner of Taxation Rob Heferen warns that people should start getting their affairs in order.
